

A FEW MINUTES WITH...

In a worrying New Year, everyone needs a psychic who talks to angels. The good news: Darkness is leaving the planet.

Do all people have some sort of psychic ability?

“Oh, yes. To get through life. To know which path to take. Most people are just kind of lost. They just don’t know. But when you start to develop this, you start to get gut feelings, you start to feel in your heart where it is that you’re supposed to be going, what God has intended. God doesn’t talk to us like, ‘blah, blah, blah.’ We get these signs, but you’ve got to be clear enough and open enough to feel and to experience the world around us and be aware of all those signs.”

How did you realize you were psychic?

“I was born with natural abilities. I could speak to the angels and see the angels, but my parents, they did not approve of this. If you get put down enough, pretty soon you start to shut down. But things always kept happening to me. I would hear something, or I would know something or I would see something. It was very, very confusing.”

If it’s not genetic then, is it something you can train for or something you just have?

“It’s interesting. I found out later in my life that both my parents were incredibly psychic. That’s why I think they were so hard on me. If it was difficult for me to be psychic and a healer, just think about how difficult it was for them.

“I think part of it can be inherited. There are people who have grandmothers who are very psychic and they’re psychic, but you can also train to be psychic. The best way to train to be psychic is to meditate.”

How does spiritual healing work?

I was supposed to tell him that just because he loves somebody doesn't mean that he should marry her. I go in my head and I'm telling these angels I don't want to tell him this. They keep going, 'You've got to tell him this. You've got to tell him this.' So, finally I say, 'All right, I will tell him.' So I tell him and he whips around and looks at me and he says, 'That's exactly what I needed to hear.'"

"Sometimes when I'm doing the readings I'll see negative things happen. I will tell people about it because I do try to help them work through it. Granted, this world is not just lollipops and sugar plums. We all have challenges that come up. It's how

we handle them that matters.”

Mind using your abilities to help us through some key issues of the day?

“Sure, I’ll play along.”

Let’s start with an easy one. Who dies first, Paul or Ringo?

[Kathleen takes out a deck of tarot cards.]

And he may even have another woman in his life right now.”

[Dealing for Ringo.]

“He’s going to go first. He’s going to have problems. He doesn’t have the credibility that Paul has. I think he actually thinks of himself as having a very good heart. He may do charity work that nobody knows about. I would say there’s conflict in him. I think he would have liked to have been Paul. Remembering now, he said they were doing so many drugs, he hardly remembers those years. What a waste.

“If I had to put money on it, I would — well, it’s not a very nice thing to do — but I’d put it on Paul living longer.”

Has Barack Obama quit smoking, and will it stick?

[She deals for Obama.]
